I am pleased to share our 2020 annual report with our community partners and constituents. 2020 was a year of uncharted territory. We all felt overwhelmed by the constant flow of new information. Meanwhile, we worried about our loved ones and what the future would hold. There was so much uncertainty and our normal began to look very different. However, there was one thing that remained constant, that was the dedication of our staff of professionals at Cornell Cooperative Extension Oneida County. Despite all that was happening with COVID they did not miss a beat throughout the year! With this in mind, It is with great pride that I reflect upon their accomplishments in 2020.

Like many of you, CCE staff had to transition to a virtual workplace overnight. Even though where they worked may have changed, their commitment to our community did not. Throughout this public health crisis, the services that CCE provides have become more relevant, critical, and urgent. As one of our constituents put it, "Thanks. I can always count on you." That quote succinctly sums up the goal of Cornell Cooperative Extension staff – to always be there for our community – in the best of times or in the most challenging of times.

CCE's Ag team distributed over 4600 face coverings, 850 gallons, and 1,075 2-ounce bottles of hand sanitizer to farmers in our community. They provided farm business management consultations, agronomy visits, and launched a new public outreach and education campaign. The 4-H youth development team completed virtual Ag in the Classroom lessons, guided club participants in volunteer activities resulting in hundreds of hours of community service, and created home-study lessons to give kids fun activities to focus on as school-based learning shifted from in-person to virtual. Our Master Gardener program increased the number of programmatic offerings in 2020 and virtual program participation has skyrocketed. The health and nutrition staff created amazing virtual videos focusing on healthy eating, obesity prevention, and the importance of physical activity.

The Child Care Council supported our essential workers with childcare scholarships and up to date information about where people could find quality childcare in the midst of daycare closings due to the pandemic. They supported childcare providers, or as they like to call them, "the essential workers behind the essential workers", with distributions of food, cleaning products, and PPE. The Oneida County Public Market continued to connect farmers to consumers, even during a brief closure. Our opioid prevention educators utilized virtual teaching platforms to continue to relay vital education.

It's impossible for me to summarize all that has happened in 2020. This 2021 Calendar shares a glance at the year 2020 and is a sampling of programmatic highlights. As always, I would like to thank our constituents, community partners, the Oneida County Executive, and the Oneida County Board of Legislators for their continued support. And I want to thank the staff at Cornell Cooperative Extension Oneida County, the Board of Directors, and all our wonderful volunteers for responding to this unprecedented crisis with professionalism and a continued drive for service, compassion, and respect for one another and all members of society. 

CENTRAL SNAP-ED-Served 2,310 adults and 3,243 youth in the 2020 fiscal year. This program serves: Oneida, Herkimer, Hamilton, and Oswego counties.

- 232 Remsen youth participated in Serving Up My Plate (Pre-COVID)
- 125 people completed Cooking Matters grocery store and Farmer's Market Tours. (An American Heart Assoc. grant provided \$15 of fresh locally grown foods from vendors at specific markets
- The nutrition department produced a number of live, remote, and recorded nutrition education lessons which included; Eating Healthy on a Budget at the Farmers' Market three-part series



EAT WELL PLAY HARD:

- Serving over 2,000 people in the 2020 fiscal year.
- Serving qualified Day Care providers in several counties of CNY, providing programming to preschoolers, parents, and staff.
- Thea Bowman of Utica Preschool participated in our Farm 2 Preschool (F2P) program through 6 recorded lessons and food demonstrations that were shared with parents and included 3 take-home planting activities.





Horticulture and Master Gardener Volunteers (MGV)



2020 A Year of Staff and MGV's Growing Virtually

- 6 on-line garden classes were offered by MGV's and received 433 registrations and 274 views on the CCE Youtube channel
- 515 calls were logged in from county residents with horticulture questions
- · 110 soil samples were tested for pH
- MGV's reached thousands of residents through print and electronic media, sharing 109 total articles in the Rome Sentinel, Utica OD, and in various magazines
- Garden tips aired weekly on Big Frog 104 radio









COVID-19 created a resurgence for gardening

and two plastic bins, placed outside our building's front door, became our connection to the county as we received and processed; soil for pH testing, identified insects, disease, plants, shared free seeds, and more. Our on-site gardens were not accessed by our MGVs till July, so we had a late start.

URBAN GROWERS INITIATIVE

COMMUNITY NEED:

COVID-19 BROUGHT GROWING, FOOD ACCESS, AND LOCAL BUYING POWER TO OUR COMMUNITIES. THE AGRICULTURE/AG ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT WORKED WITH URBAN RESIDENTS AND POTENTIAL ENTREPRENEURS THAT DESIRED TO FARM AND MEET THE NEED FOR FRESH FOOD IN THEIR COMMUNITY. EVIDENCE HAS SHOWN THAT POVERTY, LIMITED EDUCATION, LOW MEDIAN INCOMES, AND OTHER RISK FACTORS HAVE HIGH CORRELATIONS WITH LACK OF FRESH FOOD ACCESS, INADEQUATE NUTRITION, AND FOOD INSECURITY FOR RESIDENTS OF URBAN COMMUNITIES. ONEIDA COUNTY URBAN CENTERS, UTICA, AND ROME ARE NO EXCEPTION AND HAVE BEEN THE FOCUS OF MANY FOOD-RELATED NUTRITION ISSUES AND HEALTH INITIATIVES THROUGHOUT THE YEARS



Crops

- Gauging pest pressure and/or disease on crop performance to evaluate economic risks
- Collaborated with 5 local farmers collecting forage samples to track growth and quality

County Ag
